

### Wes Streeting pledges billions to GPs in order to 'fix front door' of NHS

Health secretary wants to bring back family doctors, cut pressure on hospitals and solve pay disputes



In the first days after the election, the new Health Secretary, Wes Streeting, pledged to divert billions of pounds from secondary to primary care, a huge win for general practice that responds directly to our call for fair funding.
